Annual Spring Valley Manor POA General Meeting Monday, October 3, 2016 7:00 - 9:00 p.m.

Over 50 SVM residents and guests attended the Annual Meeting held at Fulton Park. After introductions, our guest speaker was introduced, Director Joan Adcock, LR City Board of Directors, who is running for reelection. (Her opponent, Molly Miller was confirmed to attend, but was a no-show.) Andrew Norwood, who is running for election for Justice of the Peace, District 7 was passing out flyers. His opponent, incumbent Teresa Coney was invited but could not attend.

POA Business:

David Prud'homme, POA Treasurer, gave a financial report with hand-out. Account Balance: \$6,206.
 Expenses anticipated for Halloween (\$500) and Luminaries (\$500.)

2) POA 2017 Board of Directors. The following were approved unanimously to serve on the POA Board for 2017. Officers: Jena McDonnell, president; Cathi Watkins, vice president; David Prud'homme, treasurer. At-large Board: Stacy Harter, Linda Honea, Jane Mages, Brian Sirak, Anita Spence, Erin Tripcony and Zack Truemper.

3) The following POA Annual Events were approved for 2017: Annual Clean Up, 4th of July Fireworks and Ice Cream Social, Halloweenie Roast and Chili Dinner, Luminaries. In addition, it was discussed that there were additional POA events that may be added by the POA which include the Adults-only Beer Event and the Summer Movie Nights.

4) The members approved the Triathlon Swimmers to use Lake #2 for training purposes. The swimmers will be charged \$50 per person per year and must sign a liability waiver.

5) Halloweenie Roast 2016: Several issues and concerns with the annual hay ride were discussed. We will continue hay rides for 2016 and have to discuss thoroughly for 2017. We will require chaperones for all riders under age 8. We will limit the route and try and spend the majority of time on Vista Drive. No driving on Secluded Cir/Pt. A community candy station will be at 102 Secluded Circle near the loading point. Limit the number of stops on Gorgeous View Trail (2?) and have a community candy station on Manor. A liability waiver was discussed, but a firm decision was not made.

6) POA Donations: The consensus was POA donations should be used for community building events and Suburban Improvement tax money should be used for lake, dam and community property repairs. The need to fund lake and dam maintenance was discussed. The prevailing opinion was that the neighborhood would approve of increasing the SID taxes for this purpose. SID taxes can only be increased through formal, legally required, procedures. SID #7 Commissioners will take this under advisement.

Sewer Improvement District #239: Mark Lyons, chairman of the SID #239 gave a brief history of the sewer system. The current bond is approx. half paid: \$1.1 million due. The note is anticipated to expire summer of 2029. Landmark Apts. has already paid for a tie-in to our sewer line, when Capitol Hill Apts. bought in. So their addition will not affect our bond. Mark had a copy of the 2013-2014 Audit for review. A scan copy will be sent to the POA board.

Suburban Improvement District #7: BJ Biggers, president of the SID #7 gave an update. Lake #2 will be lowered starting October 8th or 9th. Six lines of pipes will be laid to syphon off water. Repairs will be focused on the seawall and weir area. Taxes this period have raised approx. \$15,000 and normal expenses exceed \$12,000. The SID #7 has a bank cd worth over \$70,000 when it reaches maturity.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
