Spring Valley Manor POA General Membership Meeting Minutes Monday, October 1, 2018
Location: Korean Disciple Church; 600 Kirby Rd; Little Rock, AR



Meeting was called to order at 7:05pm by President Jena McDonnell. Welcome and introductions of members present were made. SID #7, SID #239 and Board members were also introduced (attached).

FINANCIAL/EVENTS: Proposed 2019 annual events discussed one-at-a-time to allow members present ample time to discuss concerns and have all questions answered. Members informed the Board had acquired event insurance coverage beginning 9/2018 (attached). Specifics of vote for 2019 proposed events' and their budget outlined below:

- 1. **2019 Annual Spring Clean Up**: Motion was made to include a Fall Clean-Up Event in addition to the Spring Clean-up Event. Motion was seconded and passed with no one in opposition (\$46.58)
- 2. July 4th Fireworks & Ice Cream Social: Secretary called for questions or discussion regarding this event. One member present suggested capping monies spent on this event at \$3,000 two other members asked if the amount could be raised. Short discussion followed explaining what monies went to pay for: ice cream social @ Fulton Park, fireworks, permit, fireworks insurance (this insurance covers the "firing" of the fireworks and not the event itself. Insurance for the actual event is included in the bundled event insurance coverage the Board recently obtained which covers all SVM events. The members were informed that an anonymous member paid for the permit each year. A motion was made to cap the overall expenses of this event to \$3,100 to allow \$100 for permit, as well as allow members to donate to the fireworks fund directly in lieu of additional POA monies being allocated towards this event. Motion was seconded and passed with 1 member in opposition (\$3,100.00).
- 3. Halloweenie Roast: Secretary introduced Halloweenie Roast Committee who discussed how the event had changed in 2017 from previous years. Inclusion of kid/family-oriented games were added in lieu of the hayrides. Committee spokesperson explained that last year 2 committee members took the day off work to prepare the games and 2 committee members took half a day off work (all personal time not reimbursed by SVM POA). Because of this, the Committee asked that the event be moved to the Saturday before Halloween when Halloween falls on a weekday. Discussion followed with 3 members present expressing their preference for the event to remain on Halloween day. Motion was made to move event to Saturday before Halloween beginning 2018. Motion was seconded and passed with 3 opposed, 28 in favor (\$200.00)
- 4. **Luminaries:** Several members expressed their preference for the luminaries to be eliminated due to cleanup falling on few members, as well as the fire hazard. The POA has all materials needed for luminaries in 2018 due to rain out in 2017 and POA President requested we use what we already have and paid for before changing event. Several ideas were discussed, and a motion was made beginning in 2019 for the luminaries to be replaced with a "month-long" winter display at Fulton Park. Motion was seconded and passed with no one in opposition (\$431.55). The Board will investigate cost of adding additional electrical outlets at the park to allow for this.
- 5. **POA Spring or Fall Social:** Short discussion regarding keeping this event if it did not bring in any donation monies. Majority present favored keeping event as they felt social events important to the neighborhood. Motion was made to keep event in 2019 as adult social. Motion was seconded and passed with no one in opposition (\$156.02).
- 6. **Triathletes:** Short discussion by members present regarding weekend/holiday use. Motion made to keep event with restrictions to weekdays and no holidays. Motion seconded and passed with no one in opposition (No cost to SVM POA).

GUEST SPEAKER: Director Doris Wright, City of Little Rock, Ward 6 spoke on the following issues:

- 1. City project converting Kanis from 2-lane to 4-lane to begin > 30 days. Stage #1 Shackleford to Bowman; Stage #2 Bowman to Gamble. At this time the City does not have the monies to continue past Gamble.
- 2. 3rd Quarter of 2019 City will begin accepting bids for Manor and Cooper Orbit infrastructure project. This will include repair of culverts between Lake #1 and Lake #2.
- 3. Roosters are against the law within City of Little Rock (City Ordinances under "fowl") 1st offense 7-day notice to remove roosters; 2nd offense citation; 3rd offense City has option to take offender to court.
- 4. Early voting to be held October 22 November 5th. Exact locations can be found at: www.votepulaski.net
- 5. Dir. Wright asked if SVM could have natural gas line. She will investigate and send to our President.

POA BOARD ELECTIONS: Four members at large were on the ballot as candidates for SVM POA Board. Laura Kendall requested she be added as a write-in. Vote was conducted via ballot (sample ballot attached). Below is final tally:

1 - Tony Pipkin (write-in) 9 - Laura Kendall (write-in) 28 - Jake Brandt 30 - Steve Clements 21 - Jon Haslauer 29 - Ross Phillips

FINANCIALS/TREASURER REPORT: Note: two members left before Treasurer Report given; Coleman & Ford. Motion was made to approve 2019 Proposed Budget Including changes due to events vote outlined above (Financial/Events). Motion seconded and passed with no one in opposition. Discussion followed regarding non-payment of dues. 118/120 households paid their 2018 mandatory POA dues. Members present were reminded how the 120 number for households was set, as well as the amended change in determining number of households in Articles of Incorporation. Board explained they had not rushed to penalties against the members who had not paid in an attempt to prevent filing a lien and resolving amicably. Short discussion of reasons cited by members who refused to pay and how the Board responded. Board also informed members present that due to legal questions asked by members not in good standing with Association due to delinquent dues, the POA had incurred yet more legal fees and would incur more due to legal fees associated with filing of liens. Several members voiced their desire for the Board to begin lien process for delinquent accounts and their opinion all members capable should be held accountable to pay. Board told members present process would be started day after meeting. Three separate motions followed; all made by non-Board members:

- 1. **FAILED**: Motion was made beginning in2019, Board would not pursue legal action against anyone who did not pay their dues as long as 90% of membership paid their POA dues. Motion was seconded and failed with 3 members in favor and 26 members opposed.
- 2. **PASSED**: Motion made beginning in 2019, before Board acted against delinquent accounts, Board sends email to members at large informing them of whomever had not paid their mandatory dues listing name(s) and lot number(s). Members at large would be informed; members listed are not experiencing financial hardship (to Board's knowledge), haven't applied for "hardship waiver" through SVM website, aren't members experiencing financial hardship who were submitted to be gifted from Pay it Forward program (PIF), but have means to pay their POA dues but refuse. Members at large to be given option to pay dues for those who refuse to pay their own dues. Motion was seconded and passed with 18 in favor and 11 opposed.
- 3. **PASSED**: Motion made beginning in 2018, Board has option to choose between filing lien against delinquent accounts or turning delinquent accounts over to collection agency. Motion seconded and passed with 26 in favor and 3 opposed.

PROPOSED AMENDING OF BILL OF ASSURANCES: Two families in SVM requested Board put for a vote to amend Bill of Assurances to allow chickens in SVM. Current BOAs prohibit chickens and livestock of any kind. Board informed members present due to number of BOAs, number of previous amendments and their age legal fees for entire process to amend BOAs was quoted between \$3,000-\$5,000. Tonight's vote was to begin step #1 of voting process required by law and required by our BOAs to amend BOAs not to actually amend

them. First step in process: send certified letters/return receipt requested to all members at large informing them of the proposed amendment. Estimated cost for first step \$500-\$1500 (include but not limited to,certified letters/return receipt, printing, envelopes. Motion made to begin process (Step #1) of membership at large voting to amend BOAs to allow chickens (not roosters) in SVM. Motion seconded and failed with 7 in favor and 25 opposed. Vote conducted via ballot.

SID #7 UPDATE: SID #7 Treasurer gave their financial report (attached).

SID #239 UPDATE: SID #239 Commissioner gave their financial report (attached). It was announced that former Board member Cathi Watkins would be instated as SID #239 Commissioner in the near future.

NEW BUSINESS:

Dumpster: Board President announced SVM would have a dumpster again with dates of November 9-13th at the empty lot near 31 Vista Drive.

SVM Improvement Project: Board Secretary explained that monies for a Yearly Improvement Project had been added to the budget. Members present were asked to submit their ideas on the ballot. Each idea submitted and listed below had 1 vote unless otherwise noted:

Lake #2 / Fulton Park

- 1. Security cameras in Fulton Park to stop vandalism
 - signs about cameras
 - real lake parking facing security camera
- 2. Lake #2 security committee allow them way to monitor/keep people out who don't live @ SVM
- 3. Two Votes New sand and liner in Fulton Park @ the "old volleyball area"
- 4. Park Improvements
- 5. Ladder in lake by "old volleyball" to get out of water there
- 6. *Two Votes*: dog park
- 7. Swing Set in Fulton Park
- 8. Slide on Lake #2
- 9. More coyotes to replace stolen coyote
- 10. Card reader on back gate of Fulton Park

Lake #3 / Fulton Park

1. Sand area for Lake #3 for chairs

Walking Paths

- 1. Large walking bridge over spillway area between Lake #2 and Lake #3
- 2. Large walking bridge on areas you can't walk across on Cooper Orbit side of Lake #2
- 3. Walking path to keep walkers off Cooper Orbit (Lake #1 area of CO)
- 4. Walking paths around SVM where needed due to traffic

References for Chicken Issue Vote:

Spring Valley Manor's Bill of Assurances: poultry and farm animals of any kind are NOT allowed in our neighborhood:

Excerpt from the Spring Valley Manor Bill of Assurances:

Land Use & Building Type:

- "No business, trade, activity, or undertaking which is or may become noxious or
 offensive shall be carried on or permitted on any part of said land or shall anything be
 done thereon which may be or become an annoyance or nuisance to adjacent
 residents or the neighborhood."
- 2. "...and no lot shall be used, wholly or partly, for raising chickens or livestock."

Excerpt from City of Little Rock Ordinances:

18-52 Section B, Number 4

"The keeping of any animal, bird or fowl which by causing frequent or long continued noise shall disturb the comfort or repose of any person in the vicinity."

City Staff refer to this as the Rooster Ordinance. The LR Board of Directors specifically used broad language, such as "bird" and "fowl" to cover a host of loud crowing animals such as roosters, peacocks, geese, etc.

Roosters are not allowed within the City of Little Rock; no exceptions.
