# Meeting Highlights:

Jena McDonnell called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

# **Guest Speaker**

Jon Ford introduced guest speaker Little Rock Police Officer Michelle Howard. Officer Howard, who has been a police officer for 14 years, educated the neighbors on home safety, holiday shopping safety and general crime prevention. She distributed 3 hand-outs of information (attached) which will be posted on the SVM website, NextDoor.com

# **Financial Report**

David Prud'homme, POA Treasurer provided a written financial report (attached.) He was away on business to Jena McDonnell presented the finances. Current bank balance is \$1,143. December expenses will be the luminary bags and luminary candles of approx. \$1,500.

#### SID Report

Dusty Edwards presented a written Suburban Improvement District (SID) Financial Report (attached.)

#### **Old Business**

Zack Truemper and Jena McDonnell gave a Halloweenie Roast re-cap. Approx. 100 people attended. The \$150 for 25 straw bales was paid for by the SID board for an erosion project. Thank you to the SID! We received donations of \$74 and expenses (serving items and water) were \$25. The hot dogs/buns, Fritos, chili, cheese and condiments were all donated. Neighbors suggested adding safety/caution signs for cars speeding through SVM. Lighting was sometimes an issue. Drivers were confused on which houses wanted trick or treaters. Balloons worked well but not everyone used them. Zack mentioned a Halloween feature on NextDoor.com. Will look into for next year.

#### **New Business**

A ballot of POA Board Members for 2014 was presented. The 2014 POA Board will be: Jena McDonnell, President, David Prud'homme, Treasurer, and 8 at-large members, Jon Ford, Barbara Harper, Kathy Lyon, Jane Wages, Brian Sirak, Anita Spence, Erin Tripcony and Zack Truemper.

The date for the annual <u>Luminaries will be Saturday</u>, <u>December 7<sup>th</sup></u> with a rain date of Saturday, <u>December 14<sup>th</sup></u>. 2000 Luminary bags were distributed. Fund raising goal will be \$1,500 to cover expenses of bags and

candles. After discussion, it was decided that the area of coverage will be Lake 1 and Lake 2, the dam area plus between 16393 Cooper Orbit and 16701 Cooper Orbit which includes the levy between Lake 1 and 2. The goal will be to line the lake side of Cooper Orbit which boarders Lake 2. Extra bags will be placed on the levy and the other side of Cooper Orbit. Side streets such as Secluded Circle, Manor Circle and Vista Drive will not be covered. PR message will be that we are covering the "common areas." It was suggested that a neighborhood map be provided for drivers on Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>. One neighbor suggested chalking spots where bags are to be placed as spacing varies widely. (Coverage should be a bag every 5 feet.) A neighborhood party was suggested, but not highly supported. Many neighbors have holiday parties that night and there will be a popular concert at Verizon Arena (Jimmy Buffet.) It was suggested that neighbors be given notice to put up Christmas lights by December 7<sup>th</sup> to add to the festivities of the neighborhood.

The POA board has been brainstorming about ways to increase attendance at the annual meeting. The location was changed from a nearby church to Fulton Park. Neighbors were asked if they approved of the location change. All present indicated that the park setting was agreeable.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m. At the close of the meeting, an adult neighborhood mixer started and the party ended just after 9:00 p.m.
